



ALGONQUIN LONGHOUSE HAYLUSHKA HONOR SCHOLARSHIP

History of Haylushka Honor

The word 'Haylushka' is of Winnebago origin, and was used to identify only those braves and princesses of great courage, accomplishment, and value to the welfare of their Tribe and Nation. Haylushka braves and princesses were held in high honor by their fellow braves and princesses, and all strove to be able to be called Haylushka.

In more recent times, Haylushka has come to designate extraordinary goodness and concern for other braves and princesses, in the true Christian sense, hence appropriate to the interests of the Algonquin Longhouse Federation. The use of the Winnebago ritual is significant in that the Winnebago tribes lived among, and in fact were surrounded by various tribes belonging to the Algonquin Longhouse Federation.

Haylushka Honor Scholarship eligibility

In order to be considered eligible for the Haylushka Honor Scholarship, the Brave/Princess must have successfully earned the honor to be called Haylushka, has graduated from the Algonquin Longhouse Federation program and is attending post-secondary school.

Each hunting season, the Federation has available two, One-Thousand-dollar (\$1,000) scholarships. One for a past Haylushka Brave and one for a past Haylushka Princess. The eligible Brave/Princess must fill out the Algonquin Longhouse Haylushka Honor Scholarship Application Form and related paperwork.

All applications must be received by May 1st of each year and will be reviewed by the Federation Longhouse and the two winners, one Brave, one Princess will be announced in June.
